

DAYCON RECOMMENDED PROCEDURES FOR PROPER DISINFECTION IN YOUR FACILITIES

PREPARATION

- 1. Read your disinfectant labels carefully and thoroughly. In order for the disinfectant to work, it must be used exactly as directed.
- 2. All EPA approved disinfectants require "kill claims" on each label. If you are looking for a specific virus or pathogen, always check the product label.
- 3. Be aware of the surfaces on which the disinfectant work and, more importantly, the dwell (or contact) time needed for the product. A DISINFECTANT ONLY WORKS IF THE PRODUCT IS LEFT ON THE SURFACE FOR THE AMOUNT OF TIME SPECIFIED ON THE LABEL.
- 4. Make sure your staff is trained on the location and types of all surfaces that require treatment:
 - Toilets & Urinals
 - Sinks, Counters & Faucets
 - All Restroom Dispensers (including hand air dryers)
 - Trash & Recycling Containers
 - All Restroom & Non-Restroom Floors
 - Door handles & Knobs
 - Push Plates
 - Light Switches
 - Phone Hand Sets (if you have permission to clean)
 - Conference Room Tables
 - Chair Arms
 - Kiosks and Other Public Keyboards or Electronic Equipment
 - Cleaning Equipment
 - Elevator panels (if applicable)

*Make sure you SURVEY your spaces to IDENTIFY all surfaces, as some spaces have UNIQUE touch points.

COMMON PROCEDURES

- 1. Remove all gross debris or dust from the surface.
- 2. Clean the surface using your daily, multi-purpose cleaner.
- 3. Rinse and wipe surface to remove residual detergent. This is important b/c some cleaners may interfere with a disinfectant's effectiveness.
- 4. Allow the surface to dry before applying disinfectant.
- 5. Liberally spray the surface with the disinfectant product.
- 6. Allow the disinfectant to remain (dwell) on the surface as directed.
- 7. Do not allow the disinfectant to dry on the surface.
- 8. Rinse and wipe surface to remove residual disinfectant.

RECOMMENDED PPE

- Rubber gloves that can be cuffed and are non-permeable.
- Safety goggles or glasses to prevent chemical from contacting eyes
- · Rubber soled shoes and protective shoe overlays if mopping or dumping solution

HANDLING & PRECAUTIONS

- Make sure an SDS is on hand for the chemical. They contain first aid, accidental release procedures, and proper disposal information.
- Do not use disinfectant, or other chemicals, in closed spaces without proper ventilation.
- Wash hands after use before eating, drinking, or smoking.
- Remove any clothing that has become wet with product.
- DO NOT MIX OR SIMULTANEOUSLY USE WITH OTHER CHEMICALS
